

## Parent Teacher Council (PTC)

#### **Description**:

All parents and teachers are automatically members of the Parent Teacher Council (PTC). #### Class Parent

#### **Description**:

The class parent holds a supportive and integral role in each class. This person supports the teacher with any organizational or communicative needs. This role will vary from class to class as the teacher and class parent work together throughout the year on the class' needs.

The class parent also aims to express congratulations, sympathy or concern to members of the class in the event of illness, bereavement or milestone events. The class parent holds a bridge of communication between PTC leaders and the parents in their class. They also promote fundraising and festival events, encouraging volunteerism from the other class families. The class parent is supported by other class parents, the Parent Teacher Council President and the School Administrators.

#### **Class Parent Roles and Responsibilities:**

- ➤ Collaborate with their class teacher throughout the year for specific class support. Ideas Include (but not limited to):
  - Create and share a water jug rotation schedule
  - Linen washing rotational schedule
  - Gather funds to support class items outside of the scope of what's in the curriculum or supply fees
  - Organize volunteers needed on certain days (handwork or project days)
- ➤ Attend PTC meetings and share information with their class.
- > Bring inquiries and feedback from their class to the PTC meetings.
- > Foster excitement within their class about upcoming school events.
- > Lead the way for volunteerism in the school.
- > Share PTC reminders among their class.
- > Serve as a link from the class to the greater school community.
- ➤ Connect with their teacher to learn about milestone events throughout the year to notice with the class families including:
  - Teacher and Teacher Assistant birthdays
  - Class family new babies
  - Class family bereavement
  - Teacher Appreciation week
  - Admin Appreciation day
